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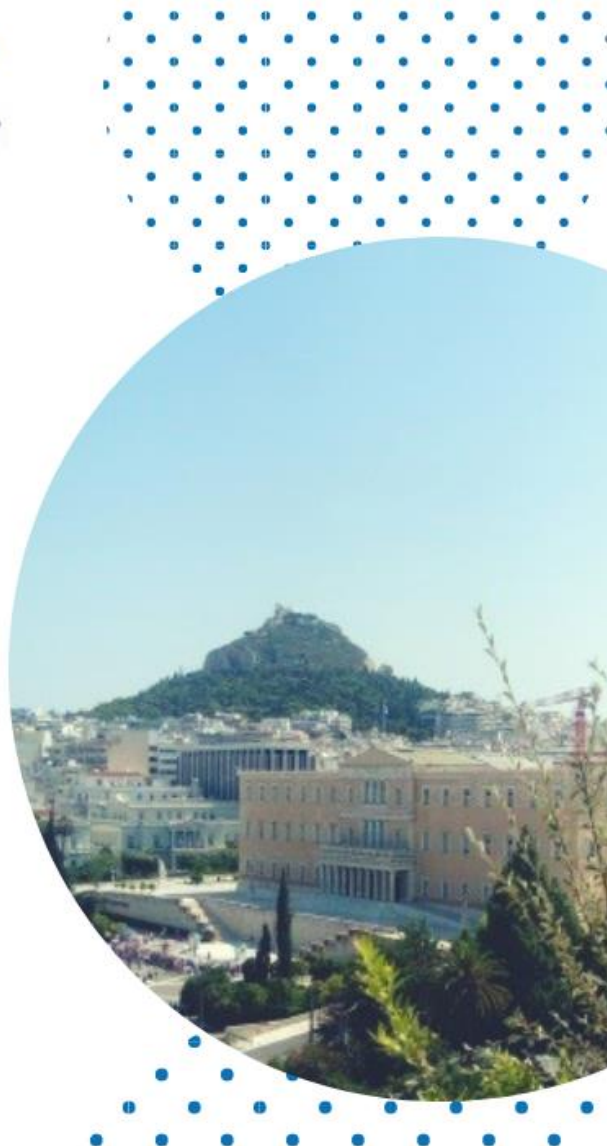

How to reach the Hotel?

From Athens International Airport (El. Venizelos) you can reach Amalia Hotel in Athens with the following options:

1. By Express Public BUS X95 (24-hour service)

The terminal stop at Syntagma Sq. is located 50 meters from the hotel.

Approximate duration of the journey is 60 minutes and the ticket costs 6.00 euros

2. By METRO / UNDERGROUND

Passengers traveling from the airport will be able to get the Metro at :00 and :30 every hour, and have to change trains at DoukissisPlakentias station in order to continue their journey.

From Syntagma Sq. station Amalia Hotel is just 100m away, walking along Amalias Ave.

The approximate time of the trip from the Airport to Amalia Hotel is 60 minutes.

The cost is 10.00 Euros per person.

3. By TAXI

The approx. time from the Airport to the Hotel is 35-40 minutes.

The cost during day-time (05.00-23.00) is 40.00 Euros and during night-time is 55.00 Euros.
